Rodney graduated high school as the state of Maryland's all-time leading scorer with over 3,000 points. He gained a scholarship to North Carolina State University, where Monroe leads in one significant statistical category. The Baltimore native finished his career as the program's all-time leading scorer with 2,551 points, breaking David Thompson's record. He was drafted by the Atlanta Hawks and played there for the 1991-92 season. After the NBA, Monroe played 14 years in Europe. Currently, Monroe is the Director of Basketball Operations and Head coach of men's basketball at SouthLake Christian Academy in Huntersville, North Carolina, where he resides with his wife, Judy, and three sons, Myles, Madison, and Christian.
